Individual Call-Ins will be accepted at **(800) 747-3279** until August 23, 2005. Individuals are responsible for their own room, tax and incidentals. When calling into reservations our group is listed as **THE HAHN ALUMNI WEEKEND**. Please use this name when making your reservations.

The rate of \$129.00 per night has been negotiated for this special weekend. You can upgrade to Executive King for \$139.00. Rate is net non-commissionable and subject to sales tax, currently 13%, as well as an occupancy tax of \$2.00 per occupied room per night. All taxes subject to change. Parking is an additional \$24.00 per day. Hotel Shuttle from the airport is offered for \$26.00 round trip or \$13.00 one way. Ground Transportation is not a necessity in New Orleans. We have excellent city transportation and all planned activities are within walking distance of the hotel. (The French Quarter is about one square mile. You can walk from one end of the quarter to the other in less than 15 minutes.)

Check-in time is 4:00 p.m. and checkout time is 12:00 p.m.
